Audubon's mission is to conserve and restore natural ecosystems, focusing on birds, other wildlife, and their habitats, for the benefit of humanity and the earth's biological diversity. Projects that support these conservation ideals, either through research or education, are eligible for this grant. Eligibility includes, but is not limited to, environmental organizations, teachers, graduate students, and research project managers. The Joseph and Joan Cullman Conservation Foundation Grants (JJCCFG) are made possible by a generous donation from the Joseph and Joan Cullman Conservation Foundation, Inc.

Terms

- Project monies will be available for distribution after May 1, 2012.
- Maximum amount of any grant is \$5,000.
- Projects funded must be completed no later than August 31, 2013.
- An informal project progress report will be due on September 31, 2012. A project completion report will be due at the end of the project.
- Funds may be used for salaries, stipends, materials, and expenses that support the specific project for which funding is requested. Overhead expenses can not be covered by funds from this grant.

Guidelines

- Complete and return the application form on next page.
- Attach your written proposal narrative (limited to two pages) and including the following:
 - Title of Project;
 - Description of the project for which funds are requested;
 - Time line of project activities;
 - Description of numbers and role of staff or volunteers involved;
 - Anticipated benefits(s) of the project, and how its success will be assessed;
 - Detailed budget specifying expenses for which funds are requested and an assessment of how your project would be affected if you receive less than the requested amount.

Some of the past projects awarded include:

- Portion of salary for summer intern at The Wild Center (\$5000)
- Portion of salary for field workers on WCS boreal bird research (\$3200)
- Great Adirondack Birding Celebration feature speaker (\$1500)
- Partial underwriting of Project Silkmoth Citizen Science project (\$500)
- Stipend for field technician studying rusty blackbirds (\$1200)
- Purchase of binoculars for Indian Creek Nature Center (\$1,500)
